



COMMON GUITARFISH

The Common Guitarfish is a cartilaginous fish with a body shape resembling a cross between a shark and a ray, featuring a flattened head, slender body, and a long, tapering tail. It inhabits coastal waters and is known for its distinctive 'guitar-like' appearance.

SCIENTIFIC NAME: *Rhinobatos rhinobatos*

DIET: Crustaceans and small fishes.

DISTRIBUTION: Eastern Atlantic and Mediterranean Sea.

MAXIMUM SIZE: 1.8m

HABITAT: Lives on the sea floor on sandy, muddy, shelly areas up to 180m deep.
