



SCALLOPED HAMMERHEAD SHARK

The Scalloped Hammerhead Shark is characterised by its hammer-shaped head with prominent scalloped edges. They are known for their schooling behaviour and wide distribution in warm coastal and pelagic waters.

SCIENTIFIC NAME: *Sphyrna lewini*

DIET: Bony fishes, sharks, rays and invertebrates.

DISTRIBUTION: Worldwide in warm-temperate to tropical waters.

MAXIMUM SIZE: 4.3m

HABITAT: Over continental and insular shelves and adjacent deep water. May dive down to deeper than 1043m.
